Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament

The Priest will place the Monstrance on the Throne. He will then descend the Altar steps and turn to face the Altar. All will then sing:

O Salutaris Hostia American (1940) Hymnal 209

Immediately followed by:

Tantum Ergo American (1940) Hymnal 199, verses 5 and 6

Priest: Thou didst give them bread from heaven. Alleluia

People: Containing within itself all sweetness. Alleluia

Priest: O God, who under a wonderful Sacrament, hast left unto us a memorial of Thy Passion; grant us, we beseech Thee, so to venerate the sacred mysteries of Thy Body and Blood; that we may ever perceive within ourselves the fruit of thy redemption, Who livest and reignest, world without end.

People: Amen

The Divine Praises *All repeat each phrase after the Priest*

Blessed be God

Blessed be His holy Name.

Blessed be Jesus Christ, true God and true Man.

Blessed be the name of Jesus.

Blessed be His Most Sacred Heart.

Blessed be His Most Precious Blood.

Blessed be Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar.

Blessed be the Holy Ghost, the Paraclete.

Blessed be the great Mother of God, Mary most holy.

Blessed be her holy and immaculate Conception.

Blessed be her glorious Assumption.

Blessed be the name of Mary, Virgin and Mother.

Blessed be St. Joseph, her most chaste spouse.

Blessed be God in His Angels and in His Saints.

Once the Sacrament has been returned to the Tabernacle, the choir will sing:

Psalm 117 *Sung by the choir*

Antiphon: Let us forever adore the most Holy Sacrament.

O praise the Lord all ye heathen*

praise him all ye nations.

For his merciful kindness is ever more and more towards us*

and the truth of the Lord endureth for ever, Praise the Lord.
